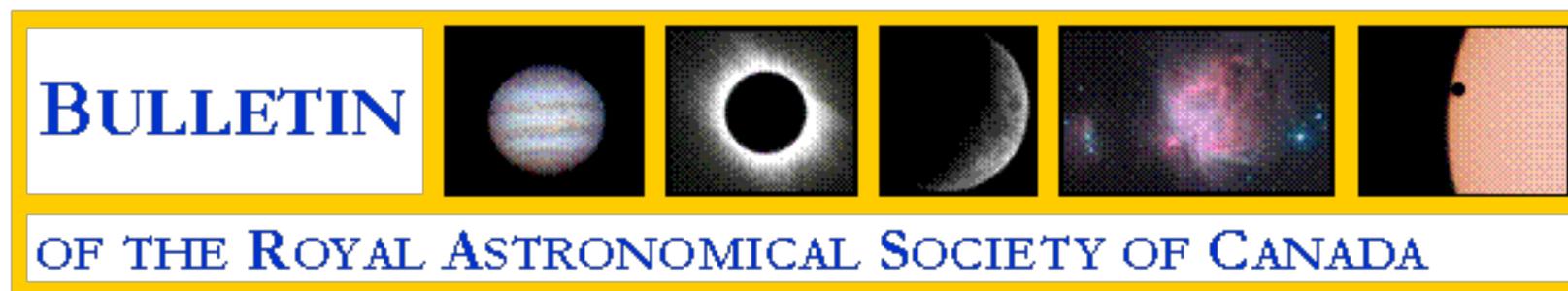

The 2008 General Assembly will be hosted by the Hamilton, Mississauga and Toronto Centres and will be held on the campus of York University in Toronto. This year's theme "**Astronomy Night in Canada**" is meant to help focus our efforts on the [International Year of Astronomy](#) [2] coming up in 2009, when up to 365 "astronomy nights" can be held across the country. The IYA is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to showcase astronomy for our friends, families, and communities, and we hope this year's GA will help to bring the incredible talents and resources of our Society to bear on this international festival of astronomy.

### Mississauga Milestone

On February 22, the Mississauga Centre celebrated its 100th meeting (62 meetings as the Mississauga Astronomical Society and 38 as the RASC Mississauga Centre). Original members Randy Attwood and Chris Malicki talked about the formation and history of the club, including some highlights from the last 100 meetings. At the end of the meeting, council and members presented a special award of appreciation to founder and President, Randy Attwood.

### Near-Perfect Eclipse Night Across Canada

A rare crystal clear and cold night greeted most of the country on February 20th as the last total lunar eclipse until 2010 occurred across all of North America. Star parties were organized by many Centres and brought many astronomy fans together for this excellent event. Here are some highlights reported to the Bulletin:

Stan Sammy, President of the **Niagara Centre**, reports that members of the Centre met at the Fairview Mall parking lot in St. Catharines, ON. The public were invited to come out and view the eclipse as well as observe Saturn and Mars, along with a few globular clusters. Even though the we were unable to have the lights turned off in the parking lot, viewing was quite good. Sammy noted that "I was quite surprised that with the cold temperatures( -16) and a steady wind, we had a fairly large crowd who stayed and viewed the entire eclipse". At times the crowd grew to over 40 hardy souls. For viewing we had a couple pairs of binoculars, an 8" dobs, 8' on an EQ mount, 15" dobs, and a 16" Lightbridge. The public were enthralled moon as it went through its phases of the Eclipse, and observing the spectacular Saturn and some of its moons.

The **Toronto Centre** hosted a major star party at the Ontario Science Centre with approximately 450 persons attending including 200 for a special "pre-eclipse" meeting that highlighted what people could expect from the eclipse. Over 25 telescopes and binoculars were available for the public to view through during the event.

Ron Baran of the **Montreal Centre** reports that their outing at the Morgan Arboretum was a great success for all. They had a wonderful turnout of participating members who brought along scopes and binoculars for all to share. The public who was on the site for the Arboretum's activities and the people who specifically came to share the eclipse experience, were all without a doubt were impressed by the friendship and the welcome that was offered by our members. Many questions were asked and many new discoveries were made. Many saw the WOW planet (Saturn) for the first time, and that was the general response by those seeing the rings of Saturn with their own eyes and not just in a photograph. Many were delighted to be able to recognize Saturn and Mars while watching our own planet's shadow in play on our moon. Congratulations to everyone who made this cold winter eclipse outing a success.
