#### Canada Wide Science Fair

Within the National Science Fair Program, the Canada-Wide Science Fair constitutes the national championship round, where finalists from Regional Science Fairs across the country meet and compete. This year's event in Kingston awarded two students with our sponsored awards for Excellence in Astronomy.

The Intermediate Award was granted to Caleb Winder from Camlachie, Ontario for his "Star in a Jar" project. Here's an abstract:

On Earth, there are limited ways of sustaining nuclear fusion reactions. One way is through a process called Inertial-Electrostatic Confinement (IEC). This utilizes ion-acceleration grids to confine a high energy plasma. These reactors are very inefficient, so it was theorized that improved grid shapes would improve the efficiency. It was found that an electro-magnetic field generating grid would confine the plasma with a

higher efficiency.

Keep an eye out for Caleb's planned Project to build the world's first amateur fission reactor.

The RASC awarded Caleb with a Celestron NexStar 5SE telescope with a PowerTank 17 and a 1 year Youth Membership in the RASC. Caleb is now a member of the London Centre.

The Junior Award was granted to Grant Mansiere from Summerland, B.C. for his project "Does Light Cause Crime?" Grant's concept was inspired by hearing of a woman who was beaten in a dark parking lot. Here's an abstract:

Is there a connection between light (measured in skyglow) and different types of crime? The analysis of crime distribution along with skyglow revealed patterns. My study backs up the surprising results from other cities that have added light (and suffered increased crime) or reduced light (and had reduced crime). Lighting can help criminals, cause health and environmental issues, and is costly. Solutions to skyglow examined.

The RASC awarded Grant with a Celestron NexStar 4SE with a PowerTank 17 and a 1 year Youth Membership in the RASC. Grant is now a member of the Okanagan Centre.

Special thanks to Colin Haig, our 1st Vice President, for representing the RASC at this year's event in Kingston. Taking a full day to participate in the ceremonies and present the awards to the talented young scientists, Colin is a past award winner of the Fair circa 1980/81?

A thank you also to All-Star Telescope's Ken From for his special consideration; supplying the Celestron telescopes and Power Tanks within the confines of the Education Committee budget.

The RASC has been a proud sponsor of the CWSF/ESPC since 1962. Next year's Fair will be held in Fredericton, New Brunswick.
