OVERVIEW OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

A preliminary schedule of activities is attached (exact times may change slightly). There are a few events to which we would like to draw your attention:

Softball Game: Bring your glove!

Slide Show: After the game, we'd like to have a evening where delegates can show slides (good or "Murphy"), perform a skit, sing a song, etc. - all in an informal atmosphere. This might a appropriate forum for those who have some slides to show but would rather avoid the somewhat more formal structure of the papers session. Talks should be limited to 5-10 minutes. Make a note on the form if you'd like to participate.

To encourage participation, we are going to select a "best of show" slide, which Ian Macgreggor, our national Newsletter editor, has agreed to publish. Ian will be the judge and his decision could be quite arbitrary - anyone could win! We might have other prizes, as well.

Symposium: In celebration of the RASC centenary, National Office is sponsoring a special public symposium on Saturday, at Carleton. Delegates are welcome to attend this free event. More information on the speakers, etc., can be found in the February issue of the national Newsletter/Bulletin.

Wine & Cheese: The traditional GA Wine and Cheese party, usually held on the Friday night, is being held this year on Saturday evening, immediately following the Helen Hogg lecture. This timing will give delegates an opportunity to meet the symposium speakers.

Papers: Delegates are invited to present a paper on any astronomically related subject. Please return the attached form, along with an abstract (approved by your Centre Council), to the address noted below, by May 18. Please plan to limit presentations to ten minutes.

Canada Day: Sunday evening after the barbecue is being left as "free time". We recommend you consider heading down to Parliament Hill for the Canada Day festivities, including the fireworks display. More information will be provided in the programme at the GA.

Please note that no transportation is being provided to downtown, and we strongly recommend not to take your car - a number of roads are usually closed, parking is scarce, and traffic is very heavy. Public transit is the best way; we'll have directions for you in the programme. Still, things can be quite hectic - be prepared for somewhat of a "party" atmosphere, particularly over in the market area, and plan on having to walk a bit.

Indian River Observatory: We will be having an "open house" at the Ottawa Centre's Indian River Observatory over the GA weekend. No need to book anything - we'll have cars or you can take your own. There will be two times you can come on out:

Friday evening, after the slide show;

Sunday evening, for those who plan to pass on the Canada Day activities, or who want to come out later;

Banquet: The Monday evening banquet will be held at the National Arts Centre. The banquet address will be given by our retiring president, Dr. Lloyd Higgs; his talk is entitled "1995 and Beyond: The Prospects for Canadian Astronomy". Transportation to the NAC is included.

The main course for the banquet will be Chicken Cordon Bleu (ham and Swiss cheese). If for dietary or other reasons this is not suitable, please include a note with your registration and an alternate meal will be provided.

Museum Tour: On Monday morning we will be having a tour of the new Canadian Museum of Civilization across the river in Hull. The tour will include a show in the world's only combined IMAX/OMNIMAX theatre, following which delegates will be allowed to tour the Museum. Lunch can be purchased in the museum cafeteria or area restaurants.

A note of warning: Portions of the museum are not finished and some visitors who were not aware of this have left feeling they were somehow misled. Please don't let this dissuade you - there is still more to see than you will have time for, and the building itself is spectacular enough to warrant a visit. And, of course, the theatre show will "wow" you!

At the time of writing, we are unsure what film will be shown in the theatre. We are attempting to obtain "The Dream is Alive", NASA's film about the Space Shuttle programme. If unsuccessful, we'll see the regularly scheduled show, "To the Limit", which looks at various aspects of human physical performance.

Solar Observatory Tour: On Tuesday morning we will be having a tour of the National Research Council's Ottawa River Solar Observatory, located just west of Ottawa. As the site is quite limited in size, we will likely have to split the tour in two groups, and even then we may not be able to accommodate everyone - register early! When signing up for this tour, please indicate your preferred time, and if you wish to cancel if your desired time is filled. Note that as Carleton check-out time is 12:00 noon, those in the second group will have to check out before leaving on the tour (a secure storage area for luggage will be provided).

Display Competition: We encourage delegates to enter the Display Competition. More details, including a registration form, are attached.

ACCOMMODATION

As most activities will be at Carleton University, delegates will find staying in residence the most convenient (and cheapest) form of accommodation. The daily rates are: \$30.00 (single) and \$27.00 (double) per bed, including breakfast. Please note that the number of single beds is limited - please try, if possible, to arrange for a roommate. If you do ask for a single and none are available, please indicate on the registration form as to whether you would like us to:

- double you up with another delegate (\$3.00 per night would be refunded)
- cancel your accommodation (you would arrange accommodation off-campus)
- book you a double room by yourself, at \$54.00 per night

If your family needs to contact you during the GA, messages can be left 24 hours a day at the service desk, phone 613-788-5609.

For those who prefer to stay off-campus, a block of rooms has been reserved at the *Southway Inn*, 2431 Bank Street, just north of Hunt Club Road. The nightly rates start at \$71.00.

To reserve a room, please contact the Inn directly at 1-800-267-9704 by the end of May. Be sure to specify the RASC, and speak to Morris Singh if there are any difficulties.

While no rooms have been reserved, other choices include:

- Journey's End Hotel: 290 Rideau Street (at King Edward), call 1-800-668-4200 for reservations. Located in the Byward Market area, adjacent to downtown. Rates start at \$70 per night.
- Westin Hotel: 11 Colonel By Drive, call 1-800-228-3000. Located right downtown, the Westin is a top-end (and top dollar) hotel. Rates start at \$159 per night, but some special weekend deals starting at \$109 per night may be available.
- Monterey Inn: 2259 Highway 16 (just south of Hunt Club Road), call 1-613-226-5813. Located just outside the city, about a five minute drive from Carleton. Rates start at \$58 per night.

Be sure to book as early as you can, as Ottawa area hotels and motels tend to fill up early on the Canada Day weekend.

REGISTRATION

Registration Fee includes: Airport/Train station transportation, Friday evening activities, Saturday Wine & Cheese, and Sunday Papers Session (the Symposium is open to all).

Delegates are asked to please fill out the attached registration form and return by June 1, 1990 (note that Paper abstracts are due earlier). An acknowledgment will be sent.

Please order separately: accommodation, all Carleton meals, Sunday barbecue, banquet, group photo, and the Solar Observatory and Museum tours.

Non-participating Registrants: if a friend or family member is coming with you and is participating in any way (even if they are only staying in residence with you), please register them as a "non-participant". The minimal charge will enable us to produce a name tag for them.

Non-participants can purchase tickets to the various activities noted above. They can also purchase separate tickets to the Saturday Wine & Cheese, should they wish to attend.

HOW TO GET TO CARLETON

Carleton University is located off Bronson Avenue, in south Ottawa (see attached map).

By car: If you arrive via Highway 417 (the Queensway), exit at Bronson and head south about 1.7 kilometres. The entrance to Carleton is on your right, at Sunnyside Avenue.

If you arrive via Highway 16, turn right at Hog's Back Road, and left about 0.2 kilometres later, at Colonel By Drive. This leads you to the back entrance to Carleton, about 1 kilometre on your right.

If you are driving from the airport, take the Airport Parkway (it turns into Bronson Avenue). Turn left at the second set of traffic signals (Sunnyside), about 9 kilometres from the airport.

When you arrive on campus, signs will direct you to the Conference Centre (Residence Commons Building).

Parking at Carleton will be available in Lot 6A near the residence complex, at no charge from Friday evening until Tuesday morning. The cost at other times is \$2.00 (flat rate - pay each time you park). Fifteen minutes free parking is permitted in front of the entrance to the Residence Commons Building (where you register), for luggage unloading.

- By train or plane: The Ottawa Centre will arrange to pick up and drop off delegates at the airport or train station, at no extra charge. Please indicate your arrival time, flight/train number, and number of people to be transported, on the registration form. A sign-up list for return trips to the airport will be at the registration desk.
- **Rentals:** If you wish to rent a car for the weekend, we have arranged for special rates from Budget Rent-a-Car. Please refer to the attached card for more information.

1990 GENERAL ASSEMBLY DISPLAY COMPETITION

Categories

There will be four main categories for the display competition:

- 1. Observational Solar System
- 2. Observational Objects beyond the solar system
- 3. Non-observational history, public education, light pollution prevention, etc.
- 4. Instrumentation

The two observational categories may be subdivided into visual and photographic / photometric / electronic, depending on the number of entries and availability of prizes.

In addition, we intend to award a youth prize to the best entry by a member under the age of 16.

<u>Rules</u>

The rules are similar to past years:

- 1. The competition is open to any member or group of members in good standing of the RASC.
- 2. All work must be done with amateur equipment.
- 3. Entries must be presented for the first time at a GA and have been completed within the last two years.
- 4. Individuals may enter a maximum of two categories, with one entry per category.
- 5. Entrants need not attend in person but are responsible for all arrangements for transportation and display of their submissions.
- 6. Prizes will be allocated by the judges, and may be withheld in any category if the calibre of entries is not considered worthy.
