Tuesday 9 Down with Jim & Frank and back as is here they come now. Fair and cold. Grand with at flood height - Apr 9. !!!

Wednesday 10 Look dad's '37 down for switch repair & bump cap. Road drying a little and a little smoother. Rivers still very high.

Colder.

APRIL 1940

Thursday 11 a fine rain fell all morning turning to snow in the afternoon. It is still snowing as I go down to H.E. - but "already all aboard for Perimeter, Pembrokeshire."

Friday 12 a sweet ride home last night through blinding snow and over colossal bumps. 17 miles A.M. cold and sunny with sharp frost again at night. Thursday snow near the yong moon & Florida
