

The 2010 General Assembly is now only 4 weeks away! Registrations have been coming in briskly with 107 attendees registered as of May 28. **The deadline for regular registration is** *June 11*. Those wishing to take part in the St Andrews Sailing/Whale Watch and Kingsbrae Garden tour, should register [2] soon to confirm their p lace. As of May 28, thirty-nine (39) of the forty-three (43) available spots have been taken. Due to the size of the ship there is only room for 4 more people! Do not miss out!

Due to early demand for the Bay of Fundy Tides Tour, we have added a second bus. The tour already has sixty-two (62) people signed up. With a second bus, we can now accommodate a total of 90 people on this grand scenic tour, with a coastal drive along the Bay of Fundy and a chance to walk on the ocean floor at low tide.

The world's largest radio and optical star party, held annually at the National Radio Astronomy Observatory, in Green Bank, West Virginia, is offering free registration for two (2) members of the RASC!

The event takes place this year from July 7-10, on the grounds of one of the most important radio astronomy facilities in the world - the site of Frank Drake's first SETI experiments, and the Robert C. Byrd <u>Green Bank Telescope</u> [6], currently the most technically advanced single-dish radio telescope in the world. This is a full-featured star party, with optical and radio observing, and a full line-up of guest speakers - including Carolyn Shoemaker. The registrations, worth US\$85 each, will be offered on a first come first serve basis to the first two current RASC members who contact us <u>here</u> [7].

On 2010 May 5, the RASC was presented with an International Year of Astronomy 2009 Certificate of Appreciation by the International Astronomical Union, signed by the president of the IAU, Professor

Robert Williams, former director of the Cerro Tololo Inter-American Observatory (CTIO), and of the Space Telescope Science Institute (STScI), and Professor Catherine Cesarsky, IAU past president and former Director General of the European Southern Observatory (ESO).

This certificate is a public acknowledgement of the energetic and impressive effort of the RASC working as a national organization composed of centres and individuals to make IYA2009 such a success. All RASC members can feel proud of their national effort which contributed to the impressive figure of nearly 2 million Galileo moments, achieved in partnership with the FAAQ, CASCA, and unaffiliated astronomy clubs and amateur astronomers. Many individual RASC members also received IYA2009 Certificates of Appreciation from the IAU, and to all we offer our thanks and congratulations. The Canadian achievement on the 400th anniversary of Galileo's epochal telescopic discoveries provides a firm foundation upon which to further our education and public outreach.

Cotopaxi Volcano

This terrific <u>video</u> [14] was posted on the "Astronomy Picture of the Day" Web site on May 26.

The majestic volcano is first seen through breaks in fast moving clouds as the movie begins. Soon the clouds have dissipated and a sky filled with stars seems to rotate about the snow-peaked volcano's peak. The band of our Milky Way Galaxy, the dark Coal Sack nebula, and the Southern Cross can all be seen overhead. Satellites streak by from several directions. Soon thin clouds roll by and seem to make the brightest stars sparkle. On the

volcano (starting at about 1:13 of the movie), the lights of climbers flash. Near the end of the movie, a bright airplane passes over the peak with a residual trail seen drifting away.
