We have a full Moon on the 4th and a new Moon on the 18th. For anyone travelling to the Pacific Ocean or thereabouts, you will get to see a total lunar eclipse. If you are in northwestern Canada, the Moon will be occulting Aldebaran on the 21st.

Mars and Venus are in the western evening sky whereas Jupiter is well placed in the evening sky and Saturn rises in late evening.

l'Observatoire Mont-Mégantic

In mid-February, l'Observatoire Mont-Mégantic went through a brief crisis when it announced it would permanently close on April 1st. OMM is a 1.6-metre-aperture optical telescope operated jointly by Université de Montreal and Laval in the middle of a 5500-square-km park which was inaugurated as the International Dark-Sky Association's first International Dark-Sky Reserve in 2008. After Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council funding for OMM dried up in 2011, OMM received significant one-time investments from the Canada Economic Action Plan and the Canada Foundation for Innovation. The resulting February 2015 crisis was remedied when the Member of Parliament for Mégantic-l'Érable promised \$500,000 for OMM to stay open for the next two years, from the Canada Economic Development for Québec Regions fund.
